## Our CLC's response to the COVID-19 pandemic: RAINBOW BASKETS & CARE PACKAGES

When schools and the economy closed, CLC partners and school staff quickly mobilized to find a way to help families who were struggling in isolation. In order to ensure every family in our CLC basin could be served, it meant finding partners across territories to ultimately create two parallel projects that shared the same format, tools, and even some funding sources: Rainbow Baskets and Care Packages. Filled with edible treats, play and self-care items, along with a list of resources in the community, these boxes aimed to have a positive impact on psychological and emotional well-being for the whole family. It was also a way to share aid resources with families, especially for those newly vulnerable. Involving the community in the project through nominating and calls for concrete support helped also to further a culture of community caring for community.
